She is an active member of Central Florida Presbytery and is currently serving a second term on the Committee on Ministry.

Pastor Melanie and husband Steve met while they were students at Cornell Law School in



New York. They moved to Maitland in 1990 where they have been active in the local church, community and schools.

Pastor Melanie was working as a prosecutor in Orlando when she responded to God's call to seminary. She completed her supervised ministry at St. Mark's in Altamonte Springs, and a pastoral internship at College Park Presbyterian.

Pastor Melanie was an active elder at Maitland Presbyterian where she served on a Pastor Nominating Committee, chaired Adult Education, taught all ages, was a lay reader, and helped lead a mid-week outreach service. She has traveled to Nicaragua with mission teams, and also served as a volunteer chaplain in the Seminole County Jail and for the Maitland Fire Department. She continues to serve as a Bible study leader at Compassion Corner downtown.

After ten years of law school and seminary, Pastor Melanie has had enough of formal education but she isn't done challenging herself to learn and grow in new ways. She has been learning how to do stand-up comedy at open mic nights. She and Steve are training for their next trek in the Alps of the former Yugoslavia. In 2017, they made it to Everest Base Camp. Pastor Melanie practices yoga, enjoys baking and traveling, and going to the theater. She is eagerly looking forward to joining the GCPC family of faith as we discern God's leading for the future and prepare to call our next installed pastor.

On Easter Sunday, at 9:35 am, we will gather at the wooden cross placed outside the north side of the Sanctuary to add fresh flowers to the cross and release the




butterflies that we have been watching develop.

On behalf of the families we serve, thank you for your total heartfelt investment of \$2315 in 2018. Nothing is more vital in fulfilling our mission than the dedicated supporters who provide the fuel needed to lead sustainable change in our community. We are so grateful that you share in our vision of lifting others to economic self-sufficiency by offering a hand up, rather than a handout.

Your kindness helped to create a future filled with hope and independence for 11,224 unique households last year. For those seeking a dignified food assistance program, relief came in the form of our Member Share Grocery Program which helped Central Florida families retain \$4,797,563 in resources in 2018. Those in crisis situations were able to receive 10,729 units of service in our Life Enrichment Center, where they were able to stabilize their life and build the confidence needed to work towards their long-term goals. For those struggling to overcome barriers to employment, your investment helped 63 individuals secure employment through our Success Training Employment Program. Throughout the year we were able to help a total of 48 families successfully lift themselves above the poverty line—20 of which went on to achieve self-sufficiency above 200% of the federal poverty level. None of this would be possible without your generosity!
