VBS Mission Projects And You Can Help

The VBS students will be participating in three mission projects. You can help by providing some items they will be using .

- 1. Gently used sneakers for elementary- aged children to use at Eccleston School.
- 2. Items for Hygiene Kits for the homeless at Family Promise. Items include new toothbrush, small toothpaste, small comb, fingernail clippers, BAND-AID®, hand towels (16"x32" or 15"x28"), washcloths, and new bars of bath soap.
- 3. Save your pennies! Students will bring in pennies each day for a contest! This money is for our missionary, Dan Turk, in Madagascar. Dan helps the people there grow trees for food and to sell the fruit.

Conversations with Children about COVID-19

As public conversations increase around coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19), children may worry about themselves, their family and friends getting ill with COVID -19. Parents, family members, school staff and other trusted adults can play an important role in helping children make sense of what they hear in a way that is honest, accurate and minimizes anxiety or fear. CDC has created guidance to help adults have conversations with children about COVID-19 and ways they can avoid getting and spreading the disease.

Remain calm and reassuring.

• Remember that children will react to both what you say and how you say it. They will pick up cues from the conversations you have with them and with others.

Make yourself available to listen and to talk.

• Make time to talk. Be sure children know they can come to you when they have questions.

Avoid language that might blame others and lead to stigma.

• Remember that viruses can make anyone sick, regardless of a person's race or ethnicity. Avoid making assumptions about who might have COVID-19.

Pay attention to what children see or hear on television, radio or online.

• Consider reducing the amount of screen time focused on COVID-19. Too much information on one topic can lead to anxiety.

Provide information that is honest and accurate.

• Give children information that is truthful and appropriate for the age and developmental level of the child. Talk to children about how some stories on COVID-19 on the Internet and social media may be based on rumors and inaccurate information.

Teach children everyday actions to reduce the spread of germs.

- Remind children to stay away from people who are coughing or sneezing or sick.
- Remind them to cough or sneeze into a tissue or their elbow, then throw the tissue into the trash.
- Discuss any new actions that may be taken at school to help protect children and school staff. (e.g., increased handwashing, cancellation of events or activities)
- Get children into a handwashing habit.

• Teach them to wash their hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, especially after blowing their nose, coughing or sneezing, going to the bathroom, and before eating or preparing food.

If soap and water are not available, teach them to use hand sanitizer. Hand sanitizer should contain at least 60% alcohol. Supervise young children when they use hand sanitizer to prevent swallowing alcohol, especially in schools and childcare facilities.

Session Summary March 2020

The church continued to have a positive cash flow through February; but the suspension of worship services and use of the property will be a challenge moving forward. Members are encouraged to continue to support the work of the church by mailing tithes and offerings to the church office or donating on-line through the church's web-site.

Session discussed that if the church can hold steady through this time, a request could be made later this spring for approval to begin the pastor search process.

The Officer Nominating Committee will be seeking names to nominate a deacon for the class of 2020.

Session approved the recommendation of Finance and Stewardship for allocation of the Kesler bequest. Ten percent was tithed to Presbyterian Disaster Assistance for the Nashville recovery effort; half was allocated to the B&G Reserve; and the balance was allocated for new Children's Ministry initiatives and improvements promised under the agreement with Share the Care.

Approval of the AV-Upgrade Improvements was ratified. Installation is scheduled for late March but may be delayed due to supply chain interruptions. Improvements around the church property are continuing—including repurposing of Smith Hall rooms, and landscaping of the Sanctuary drop off.

Reports were received from standing committees of Session, church boards, and from the spring Presbytery meeting. Presbytery approved the church's request for micro-grant funding for hosting funerals for community members.

Five members are now working as a commission of Session charged with making recommendations for improving church communications.

Session removed Dot Wilson (passed) and Diane Stukonis (transferred) from the rolls.

Session welcomed our new Parish Associate and Children's Ministry Director and noted the impact they have already had in such a short time.

One Great Hour of Sharing

Through One Great Hour of Sharing, we become the household of God. We extend shelter to those who have no place to stay, offer compassion to those who have pain—be it physical, emotional or spiritual—and we set a feast, with God, for those who lack access to enough food to eat.
