Anne Hallum of AIR Guatemala

Special ZOOM Presentation

Thursday, November 19, 7:00

As one of the five ministries we support through our PCUSA Five Cents a Meal special offering, we have a long and important connection with AIR Guatemala and founder, Anne Hallum. An acronym for Alliance for International Reforestation, AIR is planting thousands of life-giving trees on the mountainsides of Guatemala. Without AIR, those mountain forests are decimated, allowing for devastating mud slides that make the land uninhabitable. With AIR's strategic assistance, village after village is assured that their crops have cover. They are also building fuel-efficient stoves which use only a fraction of the wood previously needed for cooking and eliminate carcinogenic smoke. AIR educates school children of the necessity

of forest preservation, and works hard with the villagers to help them become self-sustaining in their efforts to produce bountiful crops. Learn about how AIR is making a huge difference in the lives of the indigenous Mayan villagers.

Sponsored by our Outreach Committee, we will also be joined by other churches, so plan to sign up early for our special ZOOM presentation to be held on Thursday, November 19th at 7:00 PM. Turkey Time is Thornwell Time!

Each November, Grace Covenant receives a special offering to support Thornwell. Begun as an orphanage in Clinton, S.C., in 1875, today Thornwell provides services to children and families in South Carolina, Georgia and Florida. Programs include residential care, foster care, support services for families and teen moms and other programs. The pandemic may have changed some of the ways services are delivered, but the work continues. There are also free, downloadable resources for all parents helping children navigate the pandemic at their website, thornwell.org. The offering will be received any time during the first three weeks of November. Session Summary

October 2020

New elders and deacons, having been trained last month, were examined by Session. Installation and ordination is scheduled for the second Sunday in January.

The Pastor Nominating Committee has been trained and begins its work with an organizational meeting on October 20.

Session received a draft of the Mission Study Report which will be supplied to the PNC for its use in completing the Ministry Information Form (online church profile.) The Mission Study Report includes the results of the surveys and focus group discussions regarding the congregation's preferences about pastoral characteristics and skills.


Reports were received from Christian Education, Outreach, Worship and Youth regarding programs and event schedules through the end of the year. Reports were also received from the Small Blessings Board and Foundation.

Finance and Stewardship gave an update on the Stewardship 2021 budget process. Thanks to the faithful giving of members and the efforts of Session and staff to hold expenses down the finances of the church remain steady.

Session removed Anne Bohannon, who passed recently, from the membership rolls. Also removed were ten members who have not been active in the life of the church for a number of years.

Christmas is Coming!

This year many of our Christmas benevolent traditions have to be modified because of the pandemic. The Outreach Committee thought long and hard about how we can create some Christmas cheer while still staying safe. So, we won't be doing some of the things we usually do, like collecting donations of food, toys etc.

 We DO plan to make up gift bags for the clients at Share The Care, but instead of church members taking home a bag to fill, we are asking for donations at \$20 per bag (40 bags needed). The committee will buy the items and fill the bags. Donations are requested by December 6.

Instead of the usual Christmas Alternatives program, we are accepting donations to purchase items from the Presbyterian Giving Catalog (<https://presbyteriangifts.pcusa.org/gifts/>) such as chickens, goats, etc. For example, a family of chickens costs \$25 and a family of goats \$178. Training for their care is provided. The Presbyterian Giving Catalog is filled with gifts that exemplify the work prayerfully carried out by ministries of Presbyterian Mission. Every gift has the power to fulfill a need, change a life and foster hope and faith. Collectively, we are making a difference. Various groups of young people in the church will decide exactly which items to buy. Donations can be made all through November and December. Of course, if you are led to make a donation to any of the organizations that were included in Christmas Alternatives in the past, please do that.

Donations for the gift bags and for Presbyterian Gifts can be made online or added to your offering check, just note the amount for a particular project. Thank you!

Maybe one good thing about the pandemic is that it will make us "be still" and eliminate some of the busyness that often distracts us from the REAL point of Advent and Christmas.
