Quilts and pillowcases donated for 2020:

June 17 - 58 quilts donated to Harbour House

October 15 - 58 quilts (Halloween and regular prints) and 28 pillowcases to Winnie Palmer Hospital

December 16 - 65 quilts (Christmas and regular prints) and 40 pillowcases (Christmas and regular print.

Total - 181 quilts and 62 pillowcases.

Since the group started in 2004 a total of 3,127 quilts have been donated. A special thank you to those who have donated fabric and contributed cash donations and also to Outreach for their contribution to our group this year.

Welcome the Book of James into your heart and home for the Lenten Season!

The Christian Education committee is preparing a Journey through the Book of James for Lent: including at home, zoom and on-site activities that will encourage and challenge you! Pastor Melanie will be preaching five sermons on James during Lent, helping us to learn and GROW together.

Here is a little information to get you started:

Few New Testament writers achieve the clarity or the "punch" of James. He doesn't spend time expanding subpoints or worrying about the literary structure. As a result, the book of James reads like a collection of proverbs.

As leader of the headquarters church in Jerusalem, James knew how to speak with authority. You don't have to look for hidden meaning in this book. James tells you clearly how you should act. As we read together let's keep in mind the diverse audience he was addressing, which included the rich and the poor and we will also see his "asides" to specific groups.
