It means that we live by faith, which "is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen" (Hebrews 11:1).

It is also a life in which that assurance leads us to do bold things. To let the Spirit guide you regardless of possible outcomes. To model the humble, self-sacrificial life of Jesus as the most authentic witness to his influence in your life.

In 1967, Dr. Martin Luther King delivered an address to the annual convention of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference called "Where do we go from here?" One of the many memorable parts of the speech was a litany of "divine dissatisfactions" that began with this simple call: "Let us be dissatisfied until America will no longer have a high blood pressure of creeds and an anemia of deeds."

Though his analogy imagined America as a human body, he was borrowing from his understanding that the church is the body of Christ.

The resurrected body! As such, it should bear witness to radical transformation of individual lives as well as whole societies.

Where does Grace Covenant go from here? It's a question we should be constantly asking in a time when churches are shrinking and aging. What needs to change? What must we do to continue to live the resurrected life? Let's keep asking each other in the spirit of divine dissatisfaction, for we know that the Spirit of God calls us to follow Jesus out of the tomb.
