Advent is here, leading us weekly into the glorious mystery of the Incarnation: God in human flesh. Many religious traditions have stories of gods coming to earth as humans, or humans attaining some divine status. But the idea of God entering humanity as a vulnerable newborn is, as far as I know, unique to the Christian faith. God felt like what it was to be human in all its joy and pain, in all its wonder and its mundanity. What a wonderful God we worship and serve!

This intimacy between the human and the divine shapes our worship in a special way

during Advent. Traditionally, we mark the Sundays with the familiar and comfortable feelings that the coming of the Christ child promises: hope, peace, joy and love. These are more than simple feelings, of course--we do them a disservice if we sentimentalize them. But this year, I thought we might examine some different Sunday "watchwords" during Advent. And this is shaped by the idea that Advent is also a time of anticipating the return of our Lord at the end of the age. This aspect of Advent is usually confined to week 1, but this year we will remain with it.




Instead of the four traditional words of Advent, then, we will explore some of what I am calling "Advent Actions" from our assigned scripture lessons. In week 1, we look to Mark 13, where the action is to "keep watch because you do not know when the owner of the house will come back." In week 2, we seek the counsel of 2 Peter, which exhorts us to "strive to be found by him at peace." In week 3, the inspiration from 1 Thessalonians to "hold fast to what is good" will carry us. And in week 4, which is also Christmas Eve, we will follow the command of Psalm 96 to "declare his glory among the nations."

As we take this side road towards Bethlehem this year, we have some special events for you to keep in mind. On Sunday, December 10, Bells

of Grace will support our striving through their beautiful music. On Sunday, December 17 the choir will help us hold fast to God's promise with their Christmas cantata. On Christmas Eve, which is a Sunday, we will declare the glory of the Incarnation through our usual two morning services and one evening service, at 6pm. All three Christmas Eve services will be identical "lessons and carols" with candle lighting.



Finally, our annual Wednesday evening worship that acknowledges the loss and grief that intensifies for some during this season will be called "Service of the Longest Night" instead of "Blue Christmas." It will be on Wednesday, December 20 at 6pm. Part of this change is to dissociate the worship with the Elvis song, and part is simply to say that when the night feels the longest, we know that is when God promises to be the closest.

I personally invite you to experience Advent and Christmas with Grace Covenant in a new and special way this year. Come and see the wondrous things that God is doing in our midst.
